

Directions to the Meadow Wood Manor

From 287 North: Travel on 287 North and exit onto 10 West (exit 39) toward Dover. Travel approximately 8 miles until Route 10 intersects Millbrook Road. Go through that intersection, making sure you are in the left lane. At the next traffic light (intersection of Center Grove Road), make a U-turn. Meadow Wood Manor is on your right.

From 287 South: Take Route 287 South to Route 10 West exit 39 B. Follow directions above.

From 80 West: Take Route 80 West to exit 43 Route 287 South. Follow directions above.

From 80 East: Take Route 80 East to exit 28 Route 46 East. At the second light, Route 46 changes to Route 10 East. Travel on Route 10 East approximately 5 miles. Meadow Wood Manor is on your right after the intersection of Center Grove Road.
